We are so pumped to present our K/1 assembly item! Keep an eye out for a clue a day on the Facebook page about our theme!

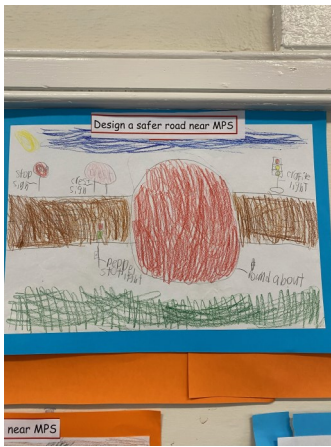
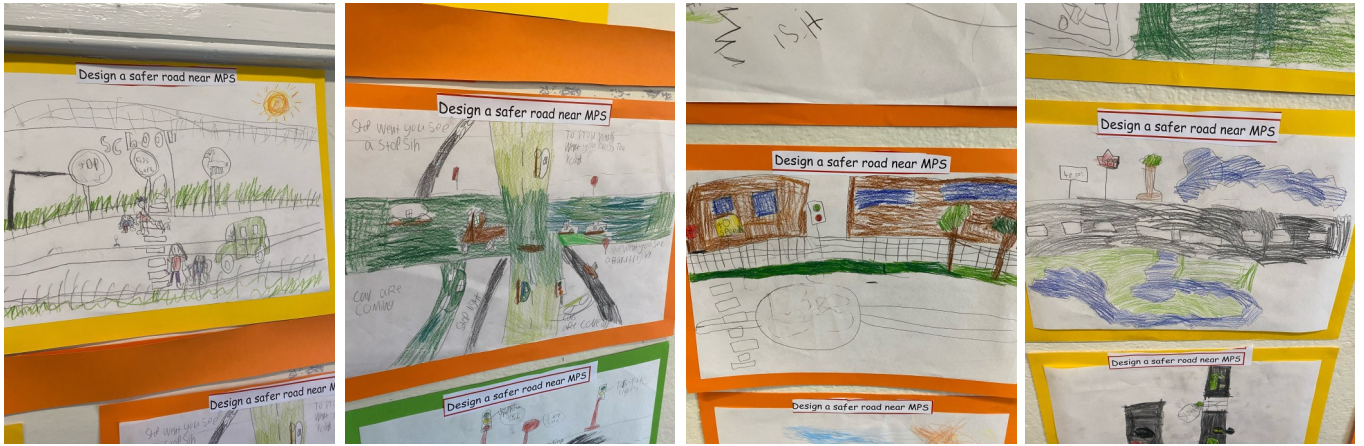
## Maths

This week we have been discussing fire safety; we talked about the emergency number 000 and design an evacuation plan for our homes.

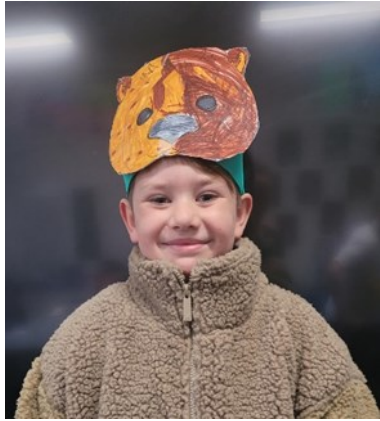
Last week we designed a safer road for our school! I am very proud of everyone's efforts.
